As apples are in season, I thought of bringing you an apple cake recipe that I like. This cake is very easy to make.

APPLE CRUMBLE CAKE makes 8 servings INGREDIENTS:

Crumble

½ cup (50 g) quick-cooking oats

1/4 cup (40 g) unbleached all-purpose flour

 $^{1}\!\!/_{\!\!4}$ cup (55 g) brown sugar

 $^{1}\!\!/_{\!\!4}$ cup (55 g) unsalted butter, softened

Apple Filling

 $3~{\rm cups}$ (360 g) McIntosh apples or Courtland, peeled, cored and diced

¼ cup (55 g) brown sugar

2 tbsp (30 ml) lemon juice

Cake

1 $\frac{1}{4}$ cup (190 g) unbleached all-purpose flour $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp ground cinnamon (a little more if you like it)

½ tsp baking soda

 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup (115 g) unsalted butter, softened

34 cup (160 g) brown sugar

2 eggs

1/4 (60 ml) sour cream

Topping

Icing sugar, for dusting

PREPARATION:

1. With the rack in the middle position, preheat the oven to 350 F (180 C). Butter the sides of an 8-inch or 20 cm springform pan with removable bottom and line the bottom with parchment paper.

Crumble

2. In a bowl, combine the oats, flour and brown sugar. Add the butter and combine just until the dry ingredients are moistened. Set aside.

Apple Filling

3. In a bowl, combine the apples, brown sugar and lemon juice. Set aside.

Cake

- 4. In a bowl, combine the flour, cinnamon and baking soda.
- 5. In another bowl, cream the butter and brown sugar with an electric mixer. Add the eggs, one at a time and beat until combined. With the machine on low speed, add the dry ingredients alternating with the sour cream until smooth. Pour into the springform pan. Drain the apple filling slightly and arrange over the cake batter in the pan. Top with the crumble.
- 6. Bake for 1 hour or until a toothpick inserted in the centre of the cake comes out clean. Let cool slightly before unmoulding. Let cool completely on a wire rack. Cool about 4 hours.
- 7. Once the cake has completely cooled, generously dust with icing sugar or to your liking.
